Shirley won the opening lead in her own hand with the club ace and immediately returned a small

trump. West knew that if he didn't win this trick he would be end played, so he played the heart Ace, then played the king and exited with the heart six.

Shirley now played her singleton Diamond. If West wins this trick and returns a Diamond, South can discard her two spades on the King and Jack of Diamonds. If West returns a Spade, South will win two spade tricks and discard the third Spade on the diamond King.

If West fails to win this trick, South will return a spade to her Ace and a small spade to the Queen, giving up one spade loser.

AFTER THE Tournament, Kay Clinton, the director of this game asked me why I didn't mention myself in this Column. So all I can say is that I was the one who doubted this contract, and that I could have beat the contract had I won the second trick as I did, then Played the Diamond ace, then the heart King and exited with the small heart.

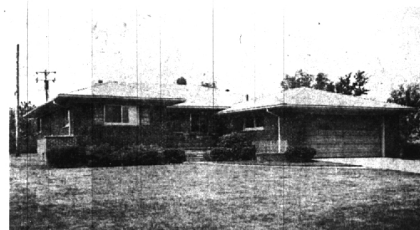

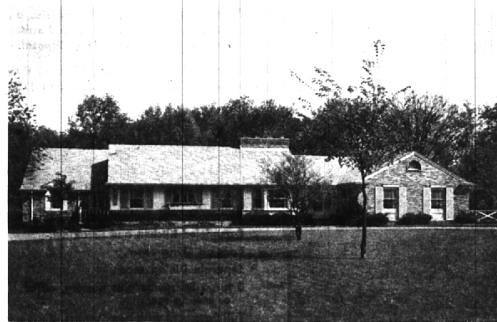
