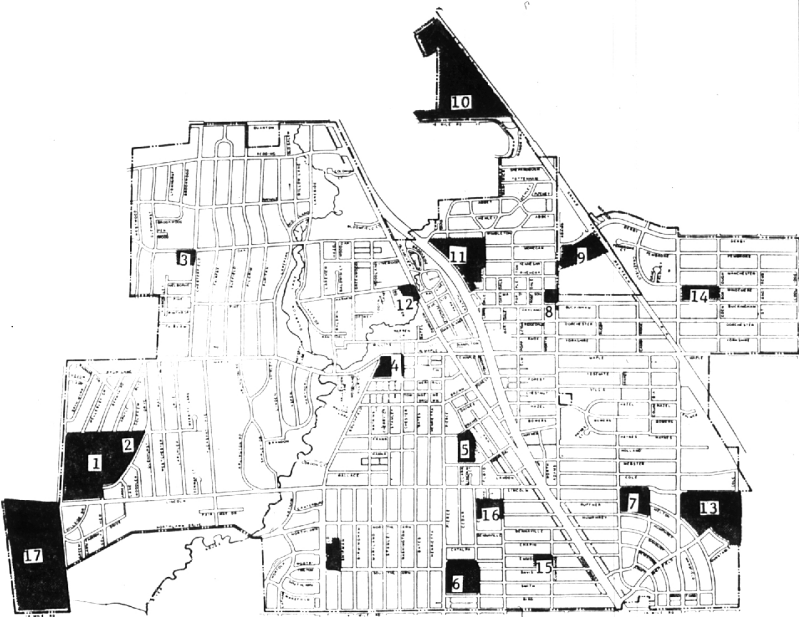

played at Springdale, Birmingham's municipal course.

OTHER SUPERVED recreational activities in the city drew 102,317 persons. In addition, attendance was not taken for informal participation on tennis courts, sled and ski slope, natural ice rinks, baseball and softball diamonds and the unsupervised playground areas.

Also, no records were kept on the number of persons using Manor Park, Quanton Lake or the areas along the Rouge River.

Recreation department figures show that ice skating and swimming attracted the most of any activity. The ice rink in Eton Park drew more than 24,000 persons in a three-month period. Natural ice rinks drew countless others.

Swimming attracted more than 40,000 persons to the three city pools. The Saturday instruction classes during the fall and winter were attended by 15,551 people.

Although Springdale is crowded, recreation department statistics show that golfers are in the minority.

CITY RECREATION Director Don Martin believes "all elements of recreation should be taken into consideration" before any action is taken on the use of the property.

Martin feels that a study should be conducted to determine the recreational needs of the city as a whole and not just for one group of sportsmen.

The solution, to the problem, Martin believes, is the construction of an 18-hole par three course that would require the use of only 12 to 18 acres at the sewage plant site.

"Similar courses have been set up at Metropolitan Beach and Lower Huron Metropolitan Park," said Martin. "Figures show that these operations have been very successful."

Lower Huron Park in Wayne County drew 2,550 players to its par three course during the month of April this year. Metropolitan Beach attracted 1,250 during the same month.

Martin pointed out that a great percentage of a golfer's time was spent using the iron and putter. "A par three course would therefore help the average golfer polish up his game," he said.

HE ALSO NOTED that many beginners, women and elderly persons who find Springdale fairways a bit too long might enjoy the smaller confines of a par three layout.

According to Martin, other facilities could be built in addition to the small course.

The site could be developed into an overnight camping spot for either scouting groups or entire families.

Along with the present sled and ski slope a shallow pond could be developed for ice skating.

Martin said he believes that the site could be developed so as to take care of "more varied recreational interests."

THE ORIGINAL public hearing on the site was held May 1 at the board tabled action.

Following the tabling of the plat at that meeting, letters were sent out to property owners on both sides of Labors Road between 13 and 14 Mile roads, inviting them to attend the May 24 meeting.

Twenty-four returned postcards indicating whether they would attend.

THE SUBDIVISION has had its moments since the plat for Nottingham Forest Sub. No. 1 was submitted in the summer of 1960.

Prematurity Defined

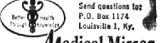
Q. How can you tell for sure whether a baby is premature?

A. The American Academy of Pediatrics and the World Health Organization define prematurity as follows: A premature infant is one who weighs 5½ pounds or less at birth regardless of the period of gestation. This definition, which relates prematurity to weight but not to gestational age, was established with the full knowledge that twins and certain other infants born at the usual time may weigh less than 5½ pounds. These underweight babies require special care and treatment and are thus medically classified as premature even though they are not actually early arrivals.

Red-Heads

Q. Is it true that freckled red-heads are quick-tempered?

A. There is no scientific basis for the belief that red hair, freckling, emotional instability, hot-headedness, etc. are related. A well-known scientist, who himself has brick-red hair and many freckles, believes that instability in red-heads, if it exists, is a result of having been teased during childhood because they were conspicuously "different."

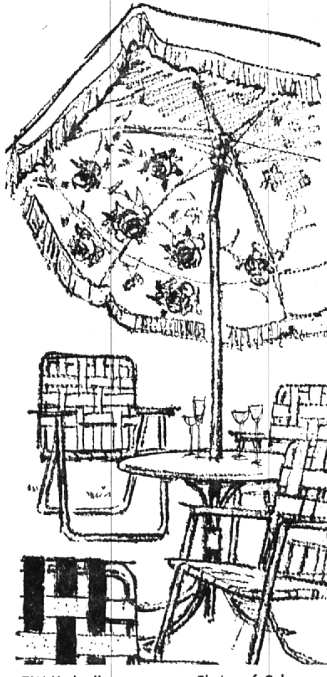

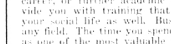
