Wiley is a member of several art and education associations. He would like to see the board of education "develop appropriate and continuing means of appraisal to determine efficiency of operation as well as the significance and worth of practices to all students in the district."

BLOOMFIELD HILLS School District voters will not only select a board member but also will make a decision on a proposed \$500,000 bond issue and two millage proposals.
