## Local Youth Wins AAA First Prize In Poster Contest

Timothy Branigin, 12, of 1622 Bates, Birmingham has won a \$25 first place award in the AAA's 18th annual traffic safety poster contest. It was announced today by the Automobile Club of Michigan.

In winning the award, Timothy, a sixth grade student at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs School, competed with more than 13,500 other entries from 35 states and Puerto Rico. His poster, illustrating the safety theme "Walk On Left Facing Traffic," was selected by a board of nationally prominent judges meeting in Washington, D. C.

A TOTAL OF 1,543 Michigan students entered designs in the competition, 144 of them receiving cash awards or other special recognition for their work. Cash prizes to Michigan students winners amounted to \$255, according to Robert E. Lewis, Auto Club contest coordinator.

The judges selected cash prize winners in four basic grade classifications—primary, elementary, junior high and senior high school. Contestants competed for awards in 11 separate categories, one for each basic safety rule.

Arrangements are being made with the schools to present the cash prizes to the award winners said Lewis.

Michigan is probably the only state ever to have organized as a state before being admitted to the Union, having at the same time a duly elected state governor and a federal territorial governor.

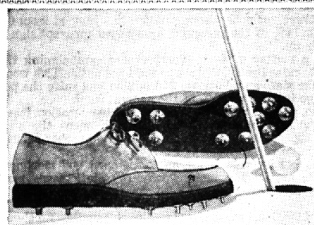

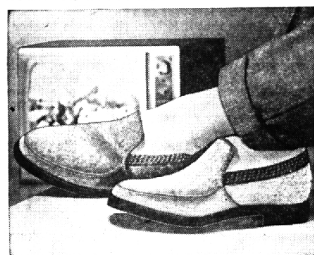
