Report of the accident came from the Navy's Atlantic Fleet headquarters in Norfolk, Va. ### Marion Dix To Present Travelogue

The first travelogue scheduled by the Department of Parks and Recreation will begin on Wednesday, Nov. 7, at 8:15 p. m. in the Southfield High School auditorium. The first lecture will highlight Miss Marion Dix. Her subject will be "Netherlands Antilles."

Miss Dix is a University of Washington graduate in journalism. She began her many-faceted career in Hollywood, writing scenarios for feature films. Responding to the lure of foreign lands, Miss Dix went to London to write scenarios for British feature films. She lived for four years in France, where she was a foreign correspondent.

DURING THE first year of World War II, Miss Dix broadcast her own commentary over short-wave radio from Paris to America. After exciting adventures escaping from Occupied France, Miss Dix wrote radio programs for U.S. networks under auspices of U.S. Government Office of Facts & Figures.

One of these regular programs, in seven different languages for the U.S. foreign population, was entitled "Uncle Sam Speaks." She wrote radio broadcasts for short-wave transmission from New York to Europe, and wrote and directed information films in the U.S., England and France, for the U.S. Government Office of War Information.
