Madame Rosina Roy, French teacher at Bloomfield Country Day School, attended a French work shop Friday to Sunday which functions under the auspices of the Detroit chapter of the American Association of Teachers of French. The conference was held at Haven Hill in the Highland recreation area.

Madame Roy was an active participant in the planning of this work shop. During the 10 years of its existence, the French government has manifested an interest in its achievements and each year some representative of the French

government attends the conference. This year the representatives were Monsieur Allain Chailous, consul-general of France in Detroit and Monsieur Rene Allewort, cultural attache in Chicago. While Madame Roy was born in this country, her parents were French and she has lived a bilingual life. She has taught in both public and private schools in this locality. Last year, at Detroit Country Day School, she was instrumental in organizing a language laboratory; this year, at Bloomfield Country Day School, she is working on a similar project.

'Broadway in Review' Topic for Woman's Club

Broadway comes to the Village Woman's Club at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday when Jean Dalrymple speaks to the women of "Broadway in Review."

Her experience on Broadway will allow Miss Dalrymple to speak of the present theatrical situation in relation to the past. She has presented 16 plays and many musicals starting in 1932 with Jose Ferrer in a series of four hit plays and continuing with Helen Hayes in "What Every Woman Knows," Françoise Tene in "The Time of Your Life" and Orson Welles in "King Lear."

Miss Dalrymple was coordinator of the United States' Performing Arts program at the Brussels Fair in 1958, the musical portion of which won the Gold Medal as best of all 49 nations taking part. She will serve as director for the New York Fair for 1964-65.

At present, Miss Dalrymple is director of New York City's Grand and Light Opera Companies of which she has been a working member since 1943. She is also one of the original producers of "The Play of the Week" television series.

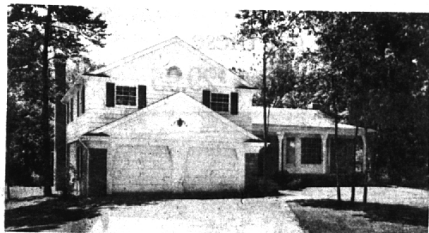

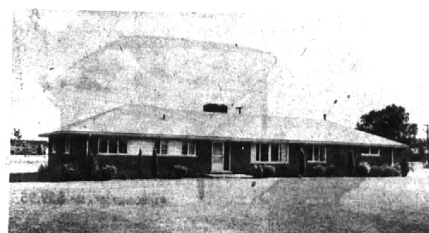
