Don Stephenson, who was a member of the board of directors of Southern Michigan Bridge Association and from the Birmingham area, finds himself in a position that he cannot play as much bridge as many of us; but when he does, I can assure you he does it with quality.

Today's hand was played at Ed Clarke's master-point tournament at the Birmingham Y.M.C.A. and as usual, Don gets the maximum from this deal. A squeeze play is always a thrill, but when it is at

seven no trump, it is sure an added thrill.

The bidding:
North East South West
1 ♠ pass 2 N.T. pass

Opening lead: K ♣
Don won the opening lead with the ace of diamonds and took time out to analyze his position.

He had four tricks in each of the dark suits, plus one diamond and three in hearts. How could he pick up the 13th trick?
If the hearts split, it was a cinch, but how to make it without putting all his eggs in one basket? He saw a plan whereby if West held the four hearts and the queen of diamonds, he was in.

Don drew out four rounds of both the dark suits and on the fourth club he dropped a small diamond from the closed hand and on the fourth spade he dropped the three of diamonds from dummy.

He now played the king of hearts from dummy and a small one back to his ace in closed hand. This left the queen and seven of hearts in dummy and the five of hearts and jack of diamonds in closed hand.

However, what would West discard on this 13th trick? If he discarded a heart, the board was good; if he discarded the queen of diamonds, Don could cash the jack of diamonds and make his 13th trick—certainly a thrill hand and

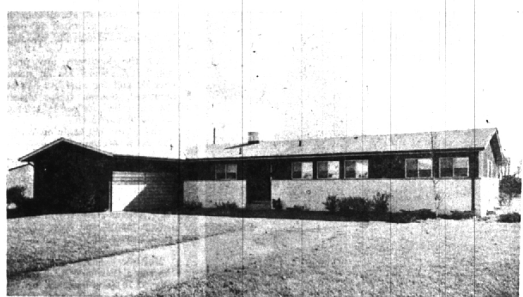

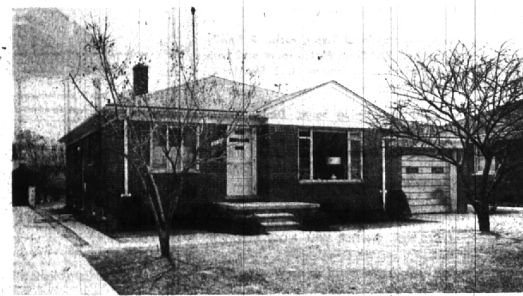

Notice Relative to Opening and Closing of the Polls

ELECTION LAW, ACT 116, P. A. 1954
SECTION 720. On the day of any election, the polls shall be opened at 7 o'clock in the forenoon, and shall be continuously open until 8 o'clock in the afternoon and no longer. Every qualified elector present and in line at the polls at the hour prescribed for the closing thereof shall be allowed to vote.

THE POLLS of said election will open at 7 o'clock a.m. and will remain open until 8 o'clock p.m. of said day of election.
