**U.S. Approves Additional Grants For Drain Work**  
 Additional grants for more than \$1.6 million toward drainage construction projects in South Oakland County have been approved, it was announced Friday by County Drain Commissioner Daniel W. Barry.  
 Under the Public Works Acceleration Act, a grant of \$1,377,671 for the \$6.5 million Dequindre-Interceptor sewer was approved by the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare. A second grant of \$273,410 toward the Red Run Drain enclosure was also approved.
