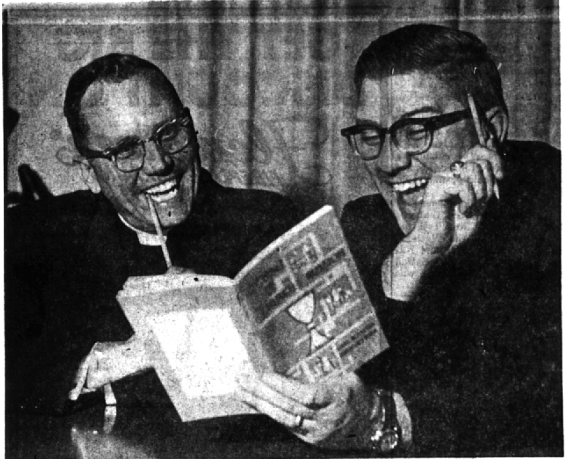

## St. Stephen's Pastor Is Co-Author of Book

The Rev. Carl R. Sayers of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, N. Adams Road, Bloomfield Township, is co-author with the Rev. Bertram T. White of a new book on Christian Stewardship, "Tithing and the Church's Mission."

Rev. White is director of the department of stewardship and evangelism for the Diocese of Michigan, Cathedral Center, Detroit. A native of Oakland County and former rector of St. George's, Milford, he lives with his wife and three children in Highland.

MR. SAYERS, 883 Madison, Birmingham, is also chaplain, with the rank of captain, in the First Missile Battalion (Nike-Hercules), 17th Artillery, Michigan Army National Guard. He came to St. Stephen's in January, 1961 from St. Luke's Episcopal Church, Allen Park, where he had served for 10 years.

With a preface by the Rt. Rev. Richard S. Emrich, Bishop of Michigan, the book is a brief and concise theology of Christian stewardship which attempts to open up worldly as well as churchly implications in Christian gift-giving.

IT WAS written to give guidance to parishes in the programs for financial canvassing. Publication is timely, because Episcopal churches annually conduct their Every-member Canvasses in October and November.

"Tithing and the Church's Mission" is written in the form of an exposition of the "Prayer for the Whole State of Christ's Church" in the Episcopal Prayer Book. Each of the paragraphs of the prayer is used as a chapter heading and sets the thesis which is delineated in the respective chapter. The style is simple and incisive and can be read with benefit by Christians of all traditions.

"THE CHRISTIAN church today," declares Fr. Sayers, "is undergoing a thorough reformation and renewal every bit as exciting as the Sixteenth Century Protestant Reformation. Signs of this modern Reformation may be seen in such evidences of new life in our churches as the ecumenical and liturgical movements, racial and cul-

turely, industrial mission, lay apostolate and Bible study.

"THE AUTHORS believe the practice of Biblical tithing is as necessary to the modern church's mission as prayer and social action."

"The church's mission to our modern world demands the kind of life-long commitment to Biblical stewardship which tithing teaches. Questionable methods of raising money employed by churches are proving inadequate for the kind of local and world-wide service to people required by the age we live in."

Published by Morehouse-Barlow, New York, the book is available through the Episcopal Book Shop in Detroit or the book tables at St. Stephen's Church Cranbrook and St. Christ's.
