S'field Gets \$879,000 in U.S. Grants

SOUTHFIELD—Applications for two grants, totaling \$879,000 have been approved in Washington, under the Federal Public Works Acceleration Act. The money will be used by Southfield to help construct buildings on its Civic Center Site, Evergreen at 10 1/2 Mile Road. The two grants, one for \$334,000 and another for \$545,000 were approved last week. The city is to match the funds. The larger sum will be used to build a joint city hall and police station, with the balance going toward a recreation building. The smaller grant will help construct a new library, a multipurpose room for the recreation building and roadways and parking lots for all three buildings. The library will contain 100,000 books. A five-member building authority has recently been appointed to build and finance Southfield's \$7 million civic center. Associate Municipal Judge Thomas Costello is chairman of the authority. The buildings financed by the grant will be the first erected on the civic center site.
