**Bruce Booth Honored by Auto Group**

Herbs of the week: Onion Soup: 1 large onion, 3 cups of stock made with U. V. extract or canned tomatoes, 4 tablespoons butter or margarine fat, 1/2 cup each dried tarragon and basil, salt and pepper, grated Swiss or Parmesan cheese, thick rounds of toast. Slice onions and fry in one until golden brown. Add stock, herbs, salt and pepper to taste. Cook slowly 10 minutes. Pour into casserole. Place thick rounds of buttered toast on top. Serve fresh or reheat. (Reheat in oven and put top hot over oven until brown.)
