

Camp Oakland Board Elects Barton to Vice-presidency

County Juvenile Court Schedules Program Workshop

Program workshops on the "Community Challenge in the Development of the Protective Service Program for Children" will be held from 5 to 9 p.m., tonight at the Oakland County Children's Center, 2050 N. Telegraph Road, Pontiac.

Sponsored by the Protective Service Program of the Oakland County Juvenile Court and the 22 Oakland County Protective Service Committees, the workshops will review the Oakland County Protective Service Program developments of the past four years and formulate a program of goals to be considered for future program planning.

One workshop will deal with protective service case work rehabilitation and the other with community program services in the prevention of juvenile delinquency and neglect.

The workshops will be manned by 16 persons experienced in the area of protective services. Invitations to participate in the workshops have been extended to 65 persons from the 22 committees throughout Oakland County.

Social Workers Name Delegate To Assembly

Representing 126 social workers in this area, an official delegate of the Oakland County chapter, National Association of Social Workers, will participate in the 1962 delegate assembly of that association in Cleveland, Ohio, Dec. 10th to 13th, and cast his vote in decisions considered to be of major importance to the future development of the social work profession, announced Charles A. Mentzer, chapter chairman.

The elected delegate of the county chapter is John Vandenberg. He will be among some 300 delegates convening in Cleveland from 162 NASW Chapters in the 50 states and Puerto Rico. The delegate assembly is the highest policy body of the association, which counts more than 35,000 individual social workers in its membership.

Norman V. Lourie, deputy secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Welfare and president of the association, expects the Cleveland assembly to set patterns for the profession which will affect it throughout the next decade.

Vandenberg, with others, will be voting on changes and extensions of the association's goals of public social policy, including positions of the profession on juvenile delinquency, national health programs and social aspects of foreign policy. Individual resolutions will, in addition, cover a wide range of specific issues on public welfare to medical insurance for the aging.
