Attorney Harry Dell of Royal Oak, representing the plaintiffs, has 20 days after the decree has been filed in which to appeal.

VILLAGE PRESIDENT Haskill Wright learned of the ruling Monday but had not received a copy of the opinion. He commented, "We're delighted, of course. But until we know if it will be appealed, we are reserving comment."

The case has already been in the Michigan Supreme Court when Judge Heer ruled for a nonsuit on a motion of the plaintiffs' wanting to delay the suit for a while without having a decision against them and the village requested a dismissal.

THE CASE was returned to circuit court on the basis that neither a dismissal nor a nonsuit was in order.

Attorney Dell said Wednesday, "The matter is under advisement. Let us say, we feel an appeal would be productive."

no final appointment of a staff, some members of his campaign organization will help him as he prepares for his new position.

In an interim post, prior to Jan. 1 when Romney takes office, will be Richard Van Dusen of Bingham Farms who will work with Swainson's executive secretary, Zoltan Perenyi.

Walter DeVries has been assigned to the department of administration on budget problems and Richard Millman will serve as press-secretary during the period before Romney's inauguration. Winding up campaign affairs will be Dr. John Dempsey and Arthur Elliott.

ROMNEY'S PLANS include meeting with state officials soon to study state budget needs.

Romney has indicated that he will work for voter approval of the new state constitution by voters next April and has expressed a desire to cooperate with Democrats who will hold posts during his coming administration.

Whether or not he will accept Gov. Swainson's offer to name a Romney nominee to the office of state controller, has not yet been announced by the governor. The office becomes vacant after Dec. 1 when Democratic Controller Ira Polley's resignation becomes effective.

DEMOCRATIC AD board members invited to attend last Friday's breakfast were Lt. Gov. T. John Lesinski, Secretary of State James Hare, Attorney Gen. Frank Kelley, Treasurer Sanford Brown and Auditor Gen. Billie Farnum.

Highway Commissioner John Mackie and superintendent of public instruction Lynn Bartlett were also invited. Lesinski and Bartlett were unable to attend.

All expressed a willingness to cooperate with the new governor as did most of the Democrat members of the legislature.

NOTABLE IN THE post-election speculating was the question of fiscal reform.

Some of the newly elected Republicans, several of whom will replace senate conservatives, have shown no great change in the GOP's attitude toward income taxes for the state. It is believed that new Democratic state Senator John Bowman of Roseville will again introduce his bill prohibiting a rise such as Detroit from levying an income tax on nonresidents.

What Romney's position will be on this issue, when and if it comes up, remains to be seen.

MEANWHILE, HE got a taste Saturday of the many questions that will be put to him in the next two years.

He was urged by an international vice president of the Hotel and Restaurant Employees and Bartenders International Union, Mrs. Myra Wolfgang, to support the enactment of a state minimum wage law. She also is secretary-treasurer of Detroit Local 705 of the union.

Mrs. Wolfgang reminded Romney that he had, in a letter to her last February, indicated recognition of a need for such legislation. The union this summer struck a number of area country clubs.
