Cornerstone To be Laid At St. Owen's

Cornerstone laying ceremonies for the new St. Owen's Catholic Church, at 6869 Franklin Road, in Bloomfield Township, will be held at 11:30 a. m., Sunday, according to Rev. Edward T. Walling, pastor. Officiating at the ceremonies will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Eugene Paddock, pastor of Holy Name Church in Birmingham, and dean of the North Oakland Deacons. Others taking part in the ceremonies will be Fr. Walling, A. Jerome Gaskier, 5659 Wing Lake Road, temporary president of the Men of St. Owen's, and Mrs. Merle Sullivan, 5590 Indianwood Trail, temporary chairman of Women of St. Owen's.

The new church, located on Franklin Road, south of Maple Road, will be equipped with an additional 198 seats available in the adjoining hall. The building was started on July 15, and completion is expected by mid-December.

St. Owen's parish was organized on June 24 of this year, and has been holding Sunday mass in the Bloomfield Hills Junior High School on Quanton Road. There are nearly 400 families in the parish which serves the southwestern portion of Bloomfield Township, Franklin and the northwest corner of Southfield.

St. Andrew To Dedicate New Church

Dedication Services will be held at St. Andrew Lutheran Church, 6255 Telegraph Road, on Nov. 25 at 4 p. m. Dr. Frank Madsen, newly elected President of the Lutheran Church in America, will be the speaker. The new church building to be dedicated contains the chapel, classrooms, fellowship room, pastor's, assistant pastor's and secretary's offices. This is the first of three units in the total plan. Ground was broken for this unit last fall. Its completion was delayed several times by strikes, but the first service was held there on Sept. 9.

The church which was organized in 1957 met in the Bloomfield Village School until the building and completion of the house-chapel on unit last fall. In January, 1958, Dr. Ronald Fuller was the mission developer, and the present pastor, the Rev. John A. Root, was called in June, 1957.

Dr. Hinsberg To Speak at Sacred Heart
