# Interest in Science Growing

Emphasis on science in education will increase in future years as an estimate of needs at Michigan State University is any indication.

A recent MSU survey for the National Science Foundation shows the East Lansing institution needs more than \$101 million for scientific buildings and equipment during the next ten years.

Dr. Milton E. Muelder, vice president for research development at MSU, said the survey represented "an honest statement of needs reflecting the tremendous explosion surrounding scientific research."

The benefits derived by all Michigan citizens from their payments to health insurance plans also is rarely contemplated by the individual. He thinks only in terms of his personal benefits.

The industry's information service notes that Michigan residents collected almost \$400 million last year for medical, surgical and hospital care and loss of income.

HIGH SCHOOL age wards of the state may soon have available to them a special scholarship fund

at several Michigan colleges and universities, according to the Department of Public Instruction.

The State Board of Education has approved a plan for granting special scholarships to these youth.

Four schools, Central, Western, Northern and Eastern Michigan, are under jurisdiction of the State Board of Education. The control board of Michigan College of Min-

ing and Technology also has created a special scholarship fund for state wards, Department officials said.

Department spokesmen said a number of high school graduates who have spent part of their lives as state wards are known to be college material. Because of their "difficult living experience" up to and through their high school years, however, they frequently do not perform well on college entrance examinations and thus do not stand a good competitive chance for scholarships.

The scholarship plan established by the Board is constructed so as to give special consideration to the unique pattern of development of these young people, Department officials said.

FULL IMPACT of this tremendous money need cannot be seen, however, without a closer look at what it would include.

Muelder said the expansion in scientific research would call for nearly 100 new faculty members at MSU, representing 56 areas of special skill not now included in the faculty ranks.

About 77 per cent of the \$101 million, or \$78.2 million, would be used for new buildings which would contain approximately 82 per cent as much space as is now available in all academic buildings on the campus.

WHERE WOULD THIS money come from? Muelder hopefully estimates about 33 per cent of the required building program and 38 per cent of the funds needed for scientific apparatus would qualify for federal support. This would amount to about \$32.7 million, he predicted.

The rest presumably would come from other public and private sources.

MICHIGAN RANKED among the top 10 states in percentage of the population covered by health insurance at the end of 1961, with 82.5 per cent of the state residents participating in some kind of plan. This represented an increase of 2.1 per cent over the number covered the previous year.
