Local Boy to Wed Girl From Toledo

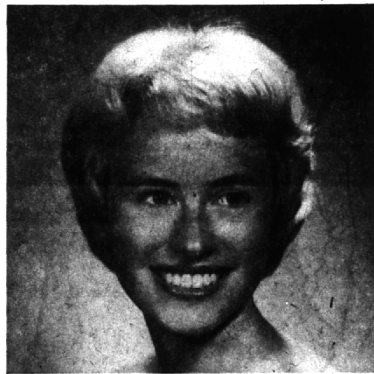

Wayne State Honors Pharmacy Graduates At Annual Reunion

Gordon F. Goyette Jr., president of the Wayne State University College of Pharmacy Alumni Association, will present gold and silver certificates to seventeen 50-year and 25-year pharmacy graduates at the association's fall reunion at 8 p.m. Sat., Nov. 17, in the Alumni Lounge on campus.

Goyette, of 7029 Springridge, Birmingham, is manager of sales training for Parke, Davis and Co. Graduates from both Wayne State and the Detroit Institute of Technology will be honored at the reunion. DIT pharmacy grads automatically became Wayne State alumni when their pharmacy school merged with the University in 1956.

'State' Well Represented at Michigan State U.

The "State" in Michigan State University is appropriate. A study Bell Telephone Co. will be the more than 18,000 members were from the state and that all 83 counties were represented.

Thirty counties sent more students to MSU than to any other college or university. Central Michigan University was second in this respect, attracting the most students in 18 counties.

Northern Michigan College led in 11 counties, Western Michigan University in 10, Michigan College of Mining and Technology and Wayne State University in four each, and the University of Michigan in three (Genesee, Washtenaw and Bay). Ferris Institute and Eastern Michigan University followed.

THREE COUNTIES—Oakland, Ingham and Wayne—each sent more than 1,000 students to Michigan State. Five counties had 500 or more students enrolled and 33 had 100 or more.

The report was published in a recent Bulletin of the Michigan Council of State College Presidents and the October issue of the MSU Magazine.

Overall registration at MSU this year is 27,728, almost 11 per cent higher than last year. The total takes in 25,914 at East Lansing, 1,256 at MSU-Oakland and 1,458 at resident centers around the state.
