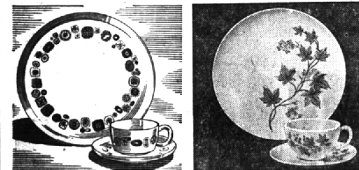

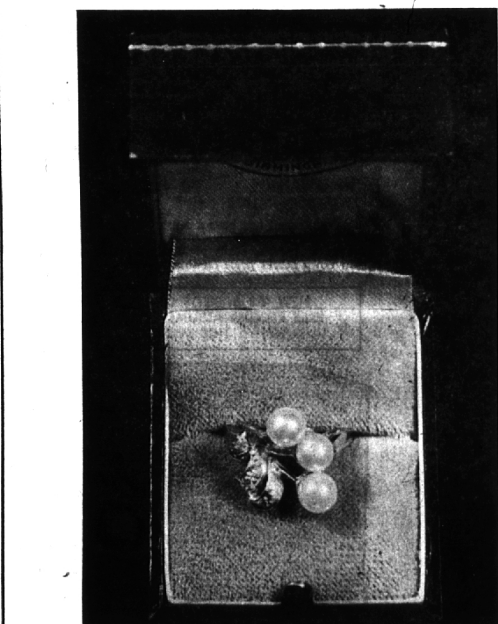

## VTC Seeks Return of Petitions

Mayor George W. Kuhn, chairman of the Vigilance Tax Committee, has issued a call for all citizens as well as area leaders in charge of distributing and collecting petitions to return the petitions to the committee's headquarters, city hall, Royal Oak. This is necessary to meet the Committee's initial deadline of November 15. Mayor William Hayward, chairman of the petition drive said "It is known that many individuals and area leaders are holding petitions which is preventing us from obtaining overall figures as to what has been accomplished and what still needs to be done." As of the first progress report meeting, held November 3, some 50,000 signatures had been collected in the metropolitan area. "The Committee has distributed over 50,000 petitions throughout the state," said Hayward, "and if we are to be successful in our drive, we need at least 13,000 returned. This requirement was determined by the vote for the office of governor approximately 2.7 million voters of which we need a minimum of eight per cent or approximately 220,000. Besides the minimum requirement, we are adding a safety factor of 30,000 for a total of 250,000 signatures."

## Broomfield Tours Berlin with House Affairs Committee

Congressman William S. Broomfield, R-Oakland County, and other members of the House Foreign Affairs Committee are on a three-week study mission to Berlin and countries behind the Iron Curtain. Members of the Foreign Operations subcommittee of the House Government Operations Committee are also on the trip which will include meetings with Russian officials in Moscow and Polish officials in Warsaw.

They will also tour NATO bases and installations in West Germany, Denmark, Portugal and Spain.

A MEMBER of the national security and Far East subcommittees, Broomfield said, "This is the first time behind the Iron Curtain for me, and I am looking forward to the experience." Mrs. Broomfield, traveling at her husband's expense, will accompany the Congressman to Europe, but will not make the journey into the Iron Curtain countries.

Broomfield is scheduled to become senior Republican next year on subcommittees dealing with the Far East and with national security and scientific developments affecting foreign policy.
