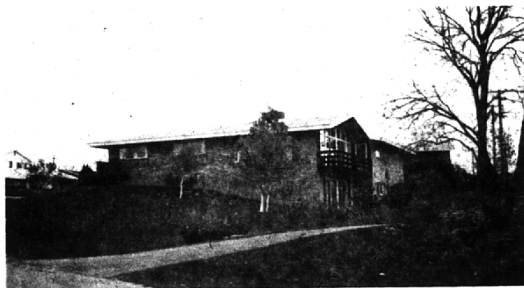

Indians on Increase At Birmingham 'Y'

Birmingham now has one-fourth of all the Indian Guide troops in the state of Michigan, according to Chester McLemore of the Birmingham YMCA. With the addition of six new tribes, the group now numbers 63 and are on the increase weekly. A father-son program, Indian guides are one of the few youth groups without a leadership problem. Age brackets for these Indian Guides include the six- to nine year olds, with the older boys becoming Warriors and forming new groups. Although the Guides are home centered, outdoor activities and physical fitness evenings at local elementary schools are stressed. At their recent fall campout at Ohivesa, 102 fathers and sons participated in canoe races, baseball games, archery contests and horse-back riding. A Spring canoe trip down the Au Sable is now being planned for the nine- to 11 year olds. The Gray Y has been set up for older boys in the fourth, fifth and sixth grades. This program stresses physical fitness as its foremost aim, and meets with professional leaders at the elementary schools.

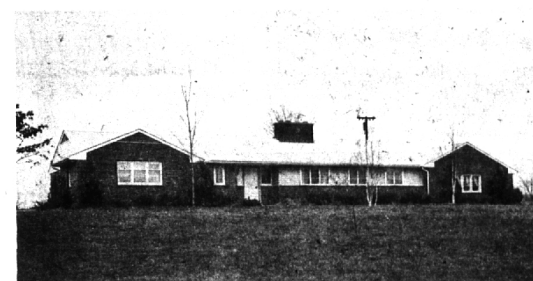

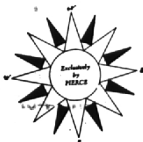

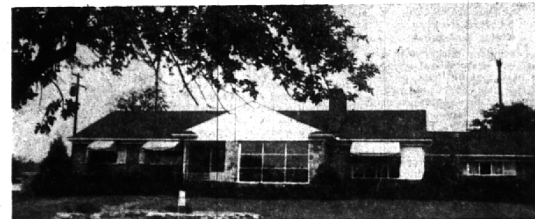
