

### Human Relations Workshops Held

An outgrowth of the MSUD Institute, the Bloomfield Township Workshop on Human Relations has been organized to examine various areas of concern on four consecutive Tuesday evenings in November and December.

George E. Gullen, Jr., chairman, Michigan Society of Mental Health and vice president, American Motors Co., was the first speaker Tuesday evening at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, 5500 North Adams Road in Birmingham.

The Nov. 20 meeting to be held at Northminster United Presbyterian Church, 9533 West Big Beaver Road, Troy, will present Dr. Mel Ravitz, sociology department, Wayne State University and Detroit councilman. His topic will be "Changing Suburbia and Its Populations."

ON NOV. 27, the panel will discuss "Religious Bases in Human Relations: What are the Divine Imperatives?"

Its participants will be Rabbi Mordecai S. Halpern, Beth Shalom Congregation, Rt. Rev. Msgr. Clement H. Kern, Most Holy Trinity Parish and Dr. James H. Laird, Central Methodist Church with Dr. Robert M. Freese, executive director, Michigan region, of the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

This meeting will be held at Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church, 5631 North Adams Road, Birmingham.

The Dec. 4 session will be held at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, 3400 South Adams, Auburn Heights. A youth panel from Southern Oakland County who are interested in the Jun or Round Table of Metropolitan Detroit will discuss "What are the Basic Issues in Human Relations?"

specific nursing procedures and approaches to patient care.

"WE ALSO have a group of seven nurses who will return to positions as head nurses and supervisors. For this group we are having special discussion groups about "in-service education" — training on the job.

"This topic was selected by the group as a basic need to improve the nursing care of patients in Peru. The group will begin to develop a plan for teaching in their respective hospitals which we hope they will be able to carry out when they return.

"HOWEVER, nursing is learned in a classroom and probably the most important classroom is the experience in caring for patients under the supervision of U.S. nurses. Here also they observe and gain experience in ward organization and administration.

"The Peruvian nurses particularly enjoy the experience in the intensive care unit where proficiency in nursing skills is particularly needed.

"We also have eight student nurses with one of their instructors. This group has been a particular pleasure as there always seems to be a particular freshness and enthusiasm of young students which is stimulating and satisfying. They attend some classes with the graduate nurses and also those planned by their instructor.

"IN THIS AREA of Peru there is a lack not only of graduate nurses but also of auxiliary personnel who have had much formal training.

"In response to a request from the local Peruvian HOPE committee, a seven months' course for the training of auxiliary personnel was begun in August. They are being taught basic nursing procedures, and skills. The group is composed of young women from the Trejillo area, and we hope they will return to work in the local hospitals.

"Other aspects of the teaching program for graduate nurses include the operating room and public health. These will be presented in other reports.

"All the U.S. nurses came to share and to teach and have participated willingly in all aspects of the nursing program."

### Attend Institute

The 10th annual institute for teachers of woodwork at the University of Michigan Nov. 17 will feature an "idea-sharing session" based on new teaching and demonstration techniques. About 100 teachers are expected to attend the conference, which is designed for the exchange of current information and analysis of the role of woodworking in a technological age. 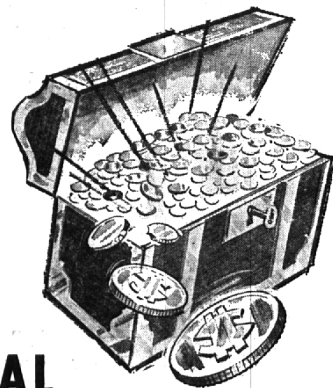
