CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORDINANCE NO. 585

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 527 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SCHEDULE OF REGULATIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 527 BY AMENDING THE REQUIRED MINIMUM OPEN SPACES SCHEDULE IN R-1 SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL ZONE DISTRICT.

The City of Birmingham Ordinance: Section 1. That the "Required Minimum Open Spaces" Schedule in R-1 Single-Family Residential Zone District be amended to read as follows:

Table with 4 columns: REQUIRED MINIMUM OPEN SPACES IN FEET, SIDE SETBACKS IN FEET OR PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL LOT WIDTH, REAR SETBACK IN FEET, and REAR LOT IN FEET. It lists various setback requirements for different lot widths and areas.

Section 2. The Schedule of Regulations attached to and a part of Ordinance No. 527 shall be deemed modified to incorporate this change.

Ordained by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 29th day of October, 1962, to be effective upon publication.
