## Girl Scouts on the March For Goodwill Industries

Seven thousand Girl Scouts and leaders of the Metropolitan Detroit Council and suburban areas are spending Thanksgiving week helping others to help themselves. In one of the largest service projects ever attempted by Girl Scouts in this area, 35,000 special clothing bags have been distributed to friends and neighbors for Goodwill Industries.

Purpose of the mammoth clothing drive is to provide a supply of material to provide training and employment opportunities for 450 physically handicapped workers at the Goodwill Industries plant. Goodwill workers will repair the donated articles which will later be sold in Goodwill stores to furnish the funds to pay wages to handicapped workers.

MRS. E. L. DAVENPORT, a member of the Metropolitan Girl Scout Council Board of Directors, is in charge of the service project. According to Mrs. Davenport, Girl Scouts look upon the Goodwill clothing drive as an opportunity to learn community responsibility.
