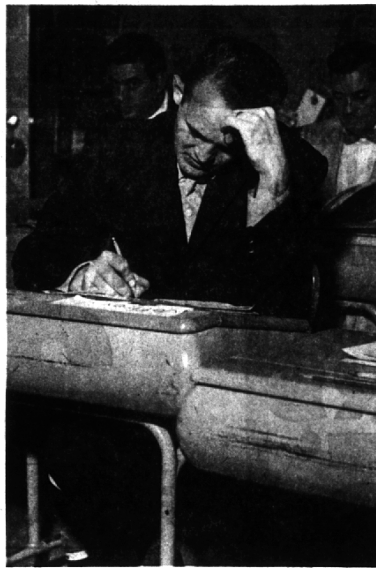


Dads' Night at B'ham's Torry Elementary

GROVES NOTES

Students Hear Noted Biochemist at Assembly

"One-quarter of all the patients in mental hospitals in the United States are schizophrenics." This was pointed out by Dr. Charles Frohman, biochemist at Lafayette Clinic in Detroit, who spoke to students and teachers at Groves Wed., Nov. 14. Dr. Frohman discussed his topic, "Biochemistry As It Applies to Mental Health," and the possibility of a hormone in the plasma of the blood being related to the disease, schizophrenia. The lecture lasted from 7:30 until 8:45 with a fifteen minute question-and-answer period at the end.

Girls from Cherry Hill, Hatton, North Farmington, Riverside and Southdale were guests of Groves' girls' Athletic Association at the GAA Sports Day Wed., Nov. 14. The six schools are all members of the Tri-River League, which holds similar sports days several times a year. Swimming, volleyball, and basketball were the main activities. The students were divided into teams for games and contests. The last highlight of the occasion was

the serving of Cokes and potato chips at 5:30.

Sales for Groves' 1962-1963 yearbook, "The Talon", began Nov. 12 and continued for that school week. Prepaid orders for the yearbooks are being sold during homeroom, lunch hour and before and after school by students in the journalism class. The goal this year is to sell 1500 copies. "The Talon" will be larger than ever, with 256 pages and at least two pictures of every student.

Friday, Nov. 9, Groves' varsity football team played Brother Rice at Groves. The game began at 3 p.m., and thus all students with activity tickets or who had previously paid the fifty-cent admission fee were allowed to miss sixth hour. The game ended in victory for the Falcons by the score of 13-0.

One hundred eighty students from public and parochial schools in the Birmingham School District have enrolled in the Saturday morning driver education course being taught at Groves this year. Serving as instructors in the class are Mr. D. Gottschalk, Mr. R. Kinne-

son, Mr. Williams, Mr. Tassio, Mr. Trayer, Mr. Carson, and Mr. Rollis.

Requirements for the course are that the student must have thirty hours of classroom instruction and thirteen hours of driving experience, one of which needs to be highway driving. After this course is completed, a student may apply for his driver's license soon after his 16th birthday. Each Saturday program involves forty minutes of driving and two hours of lecture. Each class missed has to be made up before the student is granted his certificate.

Vision testing for all students at Groves took place during the week of Nov. 5 and ended two days ahead of schedule. Parts of English, fish classes were forfeited for these

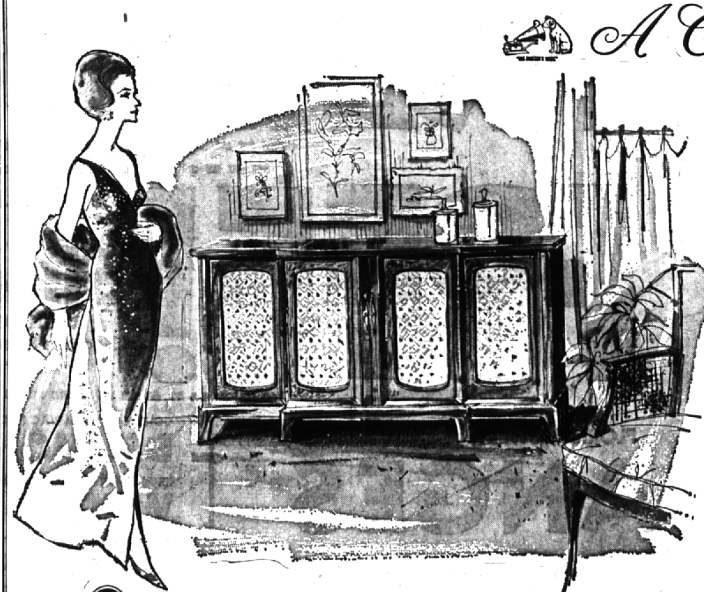
