

Two Injured In Car Crash In Township

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP—A Birmingham woman and a Bloomfield Hills man were injured Wednesday morning in a two-car collision at Maple and Cranbrook Cross roads.

Taken to William Beaumont Hospital were: Mrs. Allen N. Keenan, 30, of 431 Park Street and Theodore Luderowski, 51, of 4655 Franklin Road.

Township police, who were unable to take statements from the two drivers, said the car driven by Mrs. Keenan was traveling west on Maple. The direction in which Luderowski was driving was not yet known, police said. The accident occurred at 8:25 a.m.

A thin film of ice was on the road, police said, but lack of witnesses and the condition of the victims prevented pinpointing the accident.
