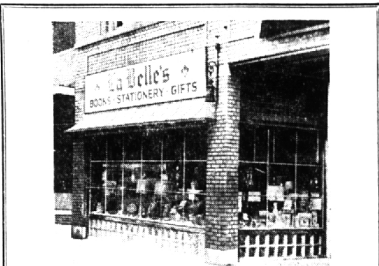
## Phi Sigma Alpha Elects Officers
