8 State Police Districts Picked As CD Centers

The eight districts of the Michigan State Police have been designated as control areas during a period of civil defense emergency. It has been announced by Capt. Richard L. Nicolen, deputy state civil defense director. The reorganization supplants the former six control areas which were established under the operational survival plan before the recent merger of the state office of civil defense with the State Police department.

The survival plan was formulated in 1959 and six control areas were designated with control centers at Escanaba, Gaylord, Muskegon, Kalamazoo, Ann Arbor and Saginaw. The centers, however, were never implemented and the revision to conform with the State Police district boundaries is believed to be more practical and operational.

HEADQUARTERS OF the eight districts are at Marquette, Traverse City, Rockford, Bay City, Detroit, East Lansing, Jackson and Paw Paw. Command officers at each headquarters will be control center officers with the district captain in charge as the state civil defense director's representative. The state director also is the State Police commissioner under the OCD merger.

The new control centers are designed not only for the relief and aid of areas affected by enemy incident, but natural disasters as well under the emergency task plan which has been in effect for some years and is headed up by the State Police commissioner. As in the past, all state agencies which have responsibilities in disasters of either type are represented, so in effect the two plans have been
