## Ditch Pitch Puzzler Pondered by Village

BEVERLY HILLS — Restoring the contour of the drainage ditches along Pierce from 13 Mile Road to Marguerite at a cost of \$450 was discussed at the council meeting Monday.

Councilman Hugh G. Allerton, Jr., was temporarily absent from the meeting, and the resulting three-to-three vote made it necessary to table action until a future date.

of an easement required in a plat submitted by Alfred J. Macksey for his "Wellesey" Subdivision at Evergreen and 13 Mile roads.

THE PLANNING board had recommended that the easement be included in the plat so that school children could use the walkway in the future. Residents objected to the easement, both by written petition and by appearing in person. The council voted that the easement need not be included, by a four to three vote.

Council President Marvin B. Cline said, "While I agree with the planning board, I don't believe we should needlessly injure or deflate property values. If condemnation action is necessary at a later date, the whole action on the walkway could be made at that time."

TO THE COMMENT of Roy Russell of McAlpine Engineers, Inc., who is preparing the plat for Macksey, that Beverly Hills was the most difficult community in the whole area in which to have a plat

accepted, Councilman Chester A. Guilmet replied, "We're more concerned about the public welfare than most communities."

Four other requests regarding the Wellesey plat were disposed of at the same time.

The council informed Macksey that 12-foot easements for public utilities could be waived in favor of 8-foot easements only by an ordinance governing easements.

MACKSEY AGREED to either construct a sidewalk along the 13 Mile Road part of his subdivision, or put the money for it in escrow.

His request that judgment on construction of a ditch along Evergreen Road be reserved until the road is paved was referred to the planning board.

Sixteen people from Our Lady Queen of Martyrs Church School requested help in getting school children safely across Southfield at Danbairne. Councilman Edward M. Shurtleff, chairman of the public safety committee, arranged to meet with representatives of the school's PTA group Tuesday evening.

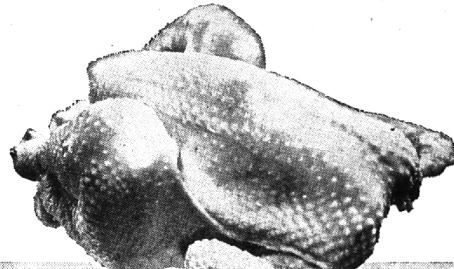
