State Drownings Show Slight Rise During Current Year

Michigan's 423 water accidents this year have claimed 210 lives and injured 186 persons, according to State Police provisional records. These figures as of September 24 represent an increase of nine in drownings but decreases of 28 in injured and 62 in accidents compared with the similar period in 1961.

The deaths include 91 swimmers or waders, 40 who fell from bridges, banks or piers, 29 boat operators,

24 boat passengers, and 26 others who drowned in miscellaneous accidents.

A marked decrease in the state's water toll is expected in the remainder of the year since water activities begin a seasonal decline in September.

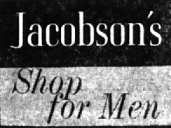

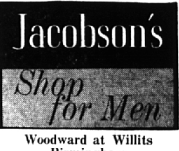

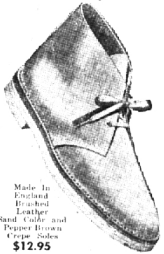
