

Launch Christian Truth Series

A series of 12 Sunday sermons on vital Christian truths and how to achieve them will be launched by Dr. Homer J. Armstrong of the First Baptist Church of Birmingham on Sunday.

"Nearly all sermons deal with the 'what' and 'why' of gospel truths and Christian living," said Dr. Armstrong, "but rarely do we preachers tell our people 'how.' We intend to do this during the weeks leading up to Christmas."

SPECIAL CARDS will be provided weekly for those in the congregation who have questions. Later, these questions will be answered during the worship service or in the sermons themselves.

The whole idea is quite different in nature from customary preaching," Dr. Armstrong continued, "and will be as new to me as to the congregation."

Following are the 12 topics and a brief description concerning them: Oct. 7—"How Can a Christian Live in a World Like Ours?" J. Edgar Hoover says that civilization is in peril and people need

"guidelines" to hold and lead them. How is it done? Oct. 14—"How Can I Improve My Life?" Ever have a physical check-up? This is a spiritual check-up. Do you know how to ask 10 vital questions about yourself? And answer them?

Oct. 21—"How Does One Have Faith?" Everyone talks about faith and religion, but how do you get it? Is it taught or caught—or natural for some and difficult for others?

Oct. 28—"How Do You Begin the Christian Life?" Big words like conversion, redemption, and salvation confuse many, and numerous churches offer "ways" to Christ. How can you simplify matters and really come to Christ?

Nov. 4—"How to Be a Good Church Member." Big words like conversion, redemption, and salvation confuse many, and numerous churches offer "ways" to Christ. How can you simplify matters and really come to Christ?

Nov. 11—"How to Give." How does one share his money in the Kingdom of God?

Nov. 18—"How to Be Grateful." This is Thanksgiving Sunday and the service will be taped and televised on WXYZ-TV, Channel 7, in the afternoon. Also, it is Will Open Day with gifts for the Children's Home.

Nov. 25—"How to Worship—How to Pray." How does one practice the presence of God?

Dec. 2—"How Does One Grow and Mature in Religious Life?" Moral and spiritual development, and how it is retarded or sped up.

Dec. 9—"How to Use Your Bible." How can you enjoy reading the Bible?

Dec. 16—"How to Know, Love and Follow Jesus Christ." How are we to think of Christ, as Son of Man and Son of God?

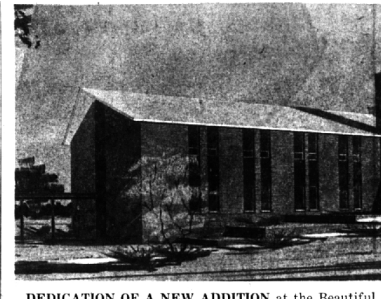

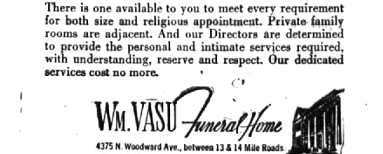
