

# Music Guild Season Begins On Oct. 16

The Cranbrook Music Guild, under the direction of M. Graham Shinnick, president, has announced its 1962-63 concert series to be held at Cranbrook House in Bloomfield Hills.

Opening the season Oct. 16 will be the Ancient Concerts Quintet. Under the direction of Homer Wickline, the group will perform on instruments that have long since disappeared from the concert stages.

The 1962 Grinnell Operatic and Piano scholarship winners, traditionally presented in concert by the Guild, will appear on Nov. 13 in the Young Artists' Program.

The last concert of the season, to be held April 16 in Kingswood Auditorium, will feature Mischa Cotler, pianist; George Miquelle, Cello; and Josef Gingold, violinist.

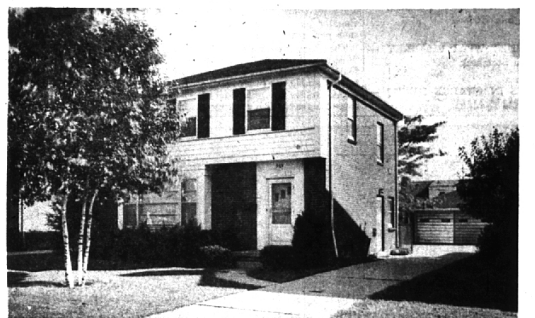

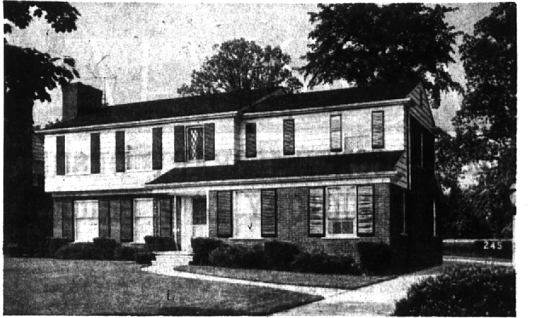
