

CANDIDATES MEET THE PUBLIC

Area Political Pace Quickens

Political activity in the Birmingham-Bloomfield area will be carried on at a fast pace during the next few days. Candidates from both parties will tour the area and address many groups.

George J. Fulkerson, Birmingham attorney and Democratic nominee for Congress from the 18th District will start the ball rolling with a noon luncheon today at the Kinsley Inn.

FULKERSON WILL lunch with former Democratic nominees for the same post he is seeking. Some were candidates before the 18th District was formed and the 17th District included Oakland County.

Chairman of the event, slated to raise funds for Fulkerson's campaign, is Draper Allen, 2348 Northlawn, Birmingham, a retired plastic manufacturer who was the Democratic candidate in 1936 and 1940.

An acceptance has been received from Mrs. Dorothy K. Roosevelt, 202 Greenwood, Birmingham, who was the nominee in 1942.

U.S. Governor T. John Leviniski will also be attending the luncheon. The Fulkerson for Congress Committee will sponsor a buffet-dance Saturday night in honor of their candidate at the Odd Fellows Hall in Hazel Park.

THE LADIES will also hit the campaign trail this week.

Mrs. John B. Swainson and Mrs. George Romney will appear on a half-hour television show 7 p.m., Oct. 22 on WXYZ-TV.

John F. Pival, president of WXYZ-TV, said the two 15-minute segments will be taped at their homes in advance.

The questions asked will deal with campaign issues and the wives will not know in advance what question will be asked.

Mrs. Romney will take a breath from her husband's gubernatorial campaign and analyze "The Teen-Ager's Challenge in Today's World" at the Y-Teen Clubs Birmingham meeting at 8 p.m. Monday in Seaholm's Little Theater.

Erin Newhouse, chair's president of the recently organized Seaholm Y-Teen Club, will introduce Mrs. Romney. Carol Vander-Roost is club vice-chairman, Mrs. Mildred Roast, teacher advisor, and Mrs. Shelby Newhouse, mother advisor.

2 Volunteer Firemen Spot, Fight Blaze

SOUTHFIELD — Two volunteer firemen from Bloomfield Township take their avocations seriously.

George Lyman and Jerry Tobias separately sighted a blaze as they were turning onto Lahser Road from the expressway last Thursday.

Both hastened to the scene — an uncompleted house at Twickingham and Travetrick — to free anyone who might be trapped with the fire burning building or injured from the blaze. (No one was.)

Tobias got there first. After checking, he called the Southfield Fire Department from a nearby gas station at 8:56 p.m., then returned to the scene to fight the fire. Lyman found him there when he arrived.

Both helped the Southfield Fire Department fight the blaze for nearly two-and-one-half hours.

The house, owned by Grossman, Inc. of Oak Park, is practically a total loss, Southfield firemen said.

The cause of the blaze is still undetermined.

Two Rezoning Issues Get Council Attention

LATHRUP — Rezoning of two separate strips of 12 Mile Road, one east and one west of Southfield Road, received council attention Monday night. Both areas are on the south side of 12 Mile Road.

Ordinance 68 was adopted and will become effective Nov. 1. It rezones from residential to transitional-professional (TP-2) the land just west of Southfield to Guy Place and includes a parking green belt in the zoning change.

The council passed a resolution opposing the land vacation. The councilmen said the vacation would, in effect, put public land into private hands.

The new ordinance includes provisions for one-story buildings for professional and public office use; specifies a five-foot high, eight-inch-thick rear wall; and limits parking to the side and front of buildings.

Its aim is to provide a buffer between residential and commercial type zoning.

Other members of the commission are Fred Chapman, Robert Reid and Andrew Snielys. Chapman and Reid were reappointed for three and two years, respectively, Monday night. Snielys' term of office has a year to run.

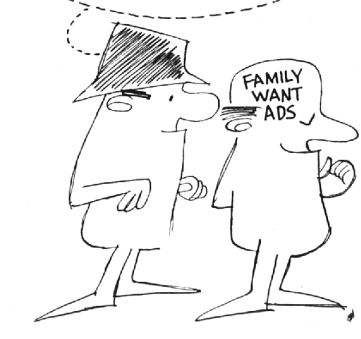

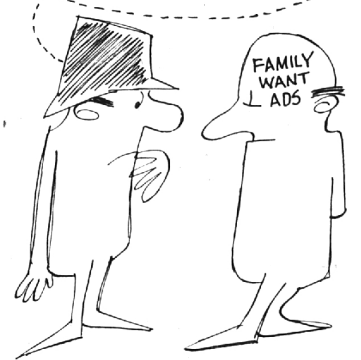

At the Sept. 24 council meeting,

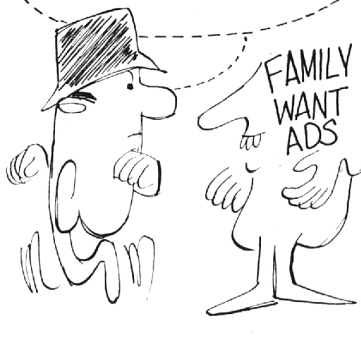
