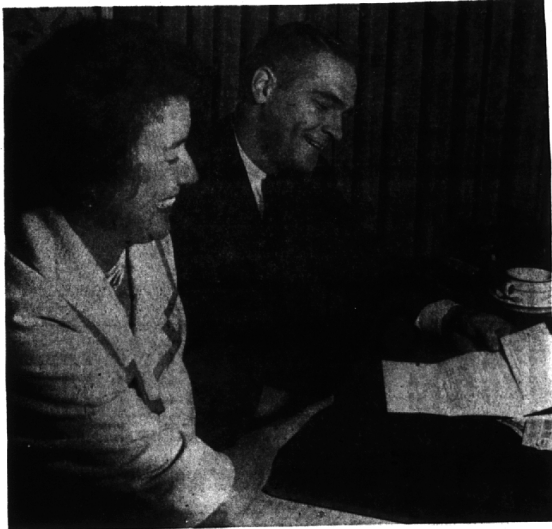

## FBI Agent Speaks To Chi Omegas

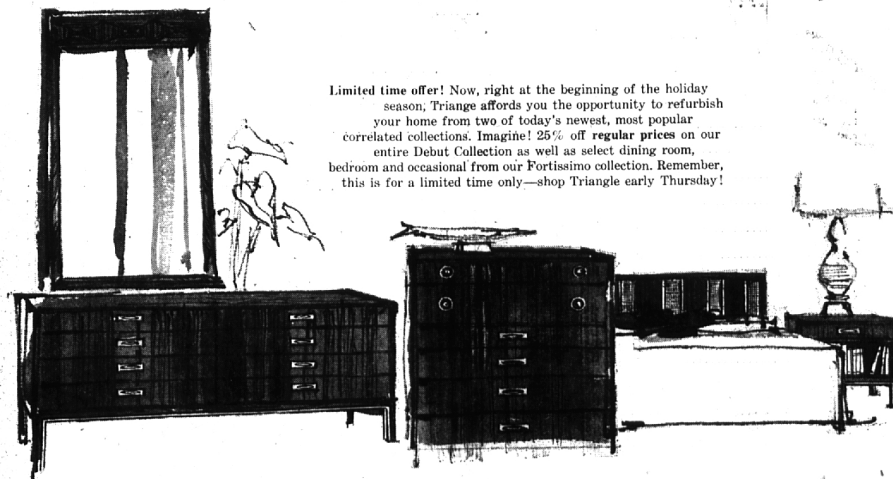

Co-hostesses are Mrs. F. J. Fitzpatrick of Berkeley and Mrs. Edwin C. Kerr of Franklin.

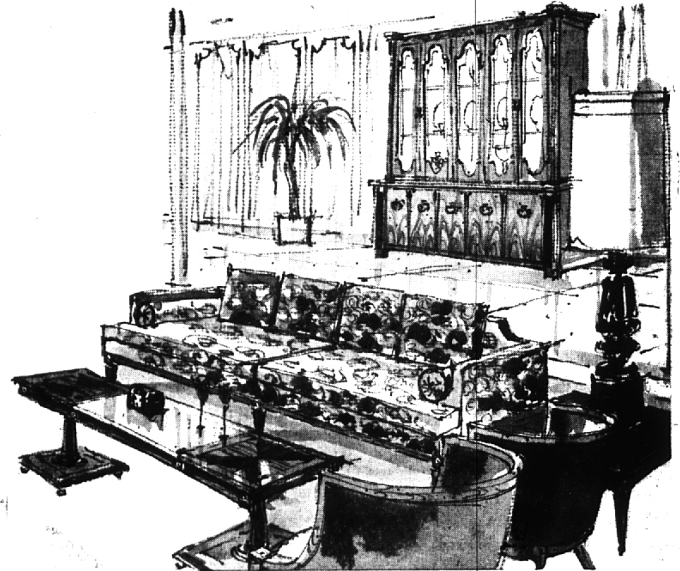
