Army Mobility Command Slates 'Procurement Fair' for Industry

Birmingham-Bloomfield area industry will be given a "ground floor" opportunity to bid on several hundred U. S. Army Mobility Command purchases—many never before procured competitively—at a "Procurement Fair" on November 1 in Detroit.

Governor Swainson and Maj. Gen. Alden K. Sibley, Commanding General of the U. S. Army Mobility Command, Center Line, announced the Fair. It will be held at the State of Michigan's Defense Contract Information Center on the fourth floor of the Boulevard Building, 7810 Woodward, Detroit.

Gen. Sibley said the Fair will open at 9 a.m. It will close at 2 p.m. unless the number of industrial representatives attending warrants keeping it open longer.

"The contracts will be small—up to \$2,500," Gen. Sibley said. "A firm will not get rich on them, but they represent an entry into defense contracting and can serve to meet overhead for small plants temporarily between commercial contracts."

"FORMERLY, MANY of the procurement actions were of the 'sole source' variety—produced and sold to the Army by a single manufacturer."

"We are now breaking them out for competitive bidding. Many of the procurement actions scheduled at the Fair will be offered competitively for the first time."

"They will cover items formerly procured by the Quartermaster, Transportation Corps, Engineer Corps and ordnance Corps—now all included in the Mobility Command. Examples are repair parts, for instance, for Army aircraft, tank-antiaircraft systems, construction equipment, and amphibious vehicles."

"This is the first Mobility Command-wide Fair."

"A visit to the Fair also will provide firms an opportunity to look over the many hundred regular procurement actions posted at the Defense Contract Information Center."

"These contracts also come from throughout my Command. It is the first time that procurement actions of an Army Command of this size—with a \$2 billion-a-year budget—have been centralized. Gov. Swainson performed a valuable service for Michigan industry in creating the Center."
