Road Work Contracts Awarded by Franklin

FRANKLIN — Contracts for emergency road work and street signs were awarded Monday night as Franklin's council met for its regular monthly session.

J. Robert Mitchell presided as president in the absence of village president Calvert Thomas. Only routine matters made up the agenda.

Along with approving an \$800 contract for 600 feet of road-work to Midwest Construction Co. for the re-inforcement of the road surface at the intersection of Brandingham and Wellington, the council also ratified the purchase of 274 new street sign plates.

COUNCILMAN GEORGE HOWARD reported that the bid from Moore Sign Co. also included sufficient brackets and posts to replace badly eroded ones throughout the village.

During the public portion of the meeting, Ben Cannon of Normandy Road announced his opposition to spot paving of the village roads. Cannon, a resident of two years, said he was uncertain about the intent of the village's small road program, now in its fourth year. Cannon contended, Franklin's unique charm would be destroyed if village roads are "patch paved," referring to small areas that were black-topped this fall.

HE URGED the council not to consider major black-topping projects, contending that paving the hilly winding streets would entice "dragsters" to make raceways of them.

Street commissioner Richard Oberschulte assured Cannon that studies were being made by the Planning commission and the council had no intention to force paving. Future plans will depend largely upon recommendation of the plan-

ning commission, Oberschulte said.

AN ATTEMPT will be made to arrange a meeting with Consumers Power Co. officials to arrive at some agreement over fee and permit matters which are presently deterring franchise progress. Councilman Edwin Webb maintained agenda.
