appellate court system and other judicial reforms.

"There are, however, certain retrogressives such as the destruction of our present method for selection of a highway commissioner, a method which helped give Michigan the finest highway system in the nation.

"THE MOST SERIOUS problem of apportionment was mishandled. The office of the chief executive is not made as strong as was envisioned. To say that you eliminated so many thousands of words or meaningless sections is not justification for acceptance of this document when the price you pay is one of setting back at least another fifty years the possibility of a real revision.

"Rejection of the proposed document now would mean we could hope for a new constitution sooner, one that did not have the political overtones of this one."

Socialist Labor candidate JAMES C. HORNATH did not reply to the questionnaire.

1. "MICHIGAN'S financial problems must be considered as a whole, not as a series of parts. Careful examination must be made of the State's spending policies as well as taxing policies, to make sure that full value is received for every dollar spent. Accounting and other physical procedures need a thorough overhaul. Tax reform is essential to accomplish the following objectives:

"Relieve the ever-increasing burden on property.

"Provide greater degree of equity for all taxpayers.
"Create climate favorable to small business.

"Establish incentive for industrial growth and the development of new job opportunities.

"The latter is one of the major reasons why tax reform is necessary in Michigan.

2. "WITHOUT ANY question, it should be adopted. It is a vehicle which provides built-in savings in government; streamlines and consolidates the unwieldy executive department; provides equitable representation in the senate and house for all the people of Michigan; improves and modernizes the state's judicial and educational systems; allows local governments to enjoy the efficiencies of home rule; provides Michigan with the finest civil rights provision of any state in the nation.

"Some financial experts estimate that the new constitution would help the state save between two and six million dollars yearly."

JAMES M. HARE (D)

Lansing, 49; AB, Wayne State University; MA, University of Michigan; presently secretary of state. 1. "A TOTAL TAX and fiscal reform action program is needed in Michigan. We must give relief to property owners. We must eliminate the business activities tax to help stimulate the economy and provide more jobs. Repealing the sales tax on food and medicine will reduce some of the present high burden on low income groups. This plan, obviously, must be tied to the acceptance of an income tax.

"There is a pressing need for having one majority party in both the Executive branch and legislative branch with the cooperative determination to put it through.

Under present apportionment, or indeed with the apportionment formula in the new Constitution, this does not seem possible.

2. "I WAS AN EARLY advocate of holding a Constitutional Convention and helped in many ways to bring it into being. The proposed Constitutional document is a substantial improvement in many fields. However, its fatal defect is that the apportionment laws would perpetuate for years a divided government in which it would be inevitable that we would have split control of the Executive office and of the Legislature.

Such deadlocks are luxuries we cannot afford. The bad image of Michigan throughout the nation is primarily brought about by this continuing deadlock. To perpetuate such a deadlock, which keeps either party from putting through a program, is too great a price to pay for a 'new' Constitution."

1. "A COMPLETE study must be made by competent persons regarding the expenditures and income of the state. We must first determine if we are getting the best possible value from the money we are spending.

"We must search to ascertain not only if we need more revenue but also if there are areas which do not require the programs we are now carrying on. In short, we need spending reform as well as tax reform. After this has been done, then I think ways must be found to reduce the burden on young business in this state.

2. "THE PROPOSED constitution not only should be adopted but it must be adopted. There are many improvements in the new document which will give to the citizens of

this state more efficient government and a more responsive government.

"While it is not perfect, the new constitution makes many improvements, especially in the fields of education, executive and judicial branches of the government. Also the apportionment of both the house and senate is vastly improved.
