The orchestra will do hunting attire, and guests will wear name tags in the form of hunting licenses. All newcomers and their friends are invited to attend.

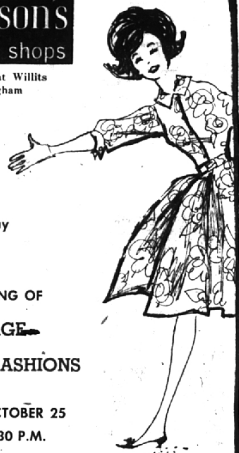
## Altar Society Plans Luncheon And Fashions

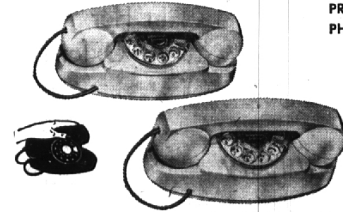
