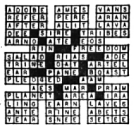
The bidding:

 Although South had a hand with huge values, she had to pass on the first round of bidding and knew that such a hand would not be passed out.

West's bid of one club is normal as well as North's double. East's bid of five clubs was his opportunity to jam up the bidding. Gladys now had her chance to make the winning bid, and West's double cannot be criticized.

Gladys trumped the opening lead of the ace of clubs and played a small diamond, the dummy's ace.
