Note Need for Driving Care as Schools Open

With the reopening of schools in Michigan and more than two million students part of the daily traffic flow, the State Police are cautioning motorists that extra care is again required to avoid accidents in school and residential areas and wherever they see the familiar yellow school buses. About 193,000 children are going to school for the first time. Less experienced in traffic than other older students, some of these first-timers may impulsively neglect their own safety in crossing streets and roads.

CITING the need for increased vigilance whenever there are children in or near traffic, the State Police point out that 104 children under 15 years of age were killed in car-pedestrian accidents in Michigan last year and another 3,504 injured. Also, in the same age group, 23 bicyclists were killed and 1,581 injured.

Traffic near school buses is especially hazardous in rural areas. In 495 rural school bus accidents last year, two children were killed and 347 other persons, including adults, injured.

Michigan law requires motorists to stop from either direction when school buses stop to receive or discharge passengers.

A NEW POINT for motorists to bear in mind is that rural school buses must be stopped on the roadway. This is in accordance with the state attorney general's opinion announced earlier this year. Previous procedure was for a rural school bus to be stopped completely off the main traveled portion of the road when possible to do so.

July Statistics For State Police

State Police officers made 17,063 arrests in July—15,510 for traffic complaints and 1,523 for criminal offenses—according to the department's monthly activity report. In addition, 496 juvenile traffic offenders were arrested and 473 delinquent and four wayward minors apprehended. Troopers made 9,615 property and 2,587 liquor inspections.

The IDENTIFICATION bureau received 11,045 sets of fingerprints of which 6,728 were criminal and 4,317 noncriminal. Forty-four wanted persons were identified. Of 1,778 applicants for permits to carry concealed weapons 154 were identified with criminal records through their prints.

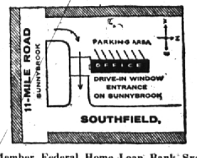
