5 Pilgrim Congregational Members Back from Meeting

Forty-nine Congregational churches were admitted into fellowship with the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches at this meeting, he added.

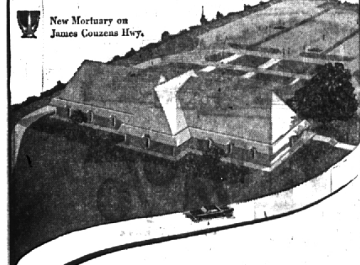
