Maple X-Country Squad 'Loaded' with Talent

"I feel that our combined potential is high enough to keep up on the winning routine of previous years," smiled K. E. Ambrose, who queried on the prospects of the 1962 Seaholm Maple cross country team. The veteran Ambrose has only three days of practice to ready his charges for the opening meeting against Turston, Monday.

Thirty-six young runners, including three lettermen, answered the call of the starter's gun.

PACING THE Maple attack this season will be senior Dave Kennedy. During the 1961 campaign Kennedy was clocked in 10:39.5 for the two-mile romp.

Stan Cutter and Tim Maker are the other letter winners returning from Seaholm to lead the 1962 Eastern Michigan League crown.

During the past eight years the Maples have won 54 out of 65 dual meets.

Also during that time eight EML championships have been scooped.

Seaholm is the only school in the state to have placed in the top ten for eight consecutive years. The state championship was won by Birmingham in 1959 and the Maples were runners-up in 1967 and 1969.

Conservation Commission To Study Regulations

Fishing regulations proposed for Michigan's 1963 season are scheduled to receive action by the Conservation Commission during its meeting at the Sheraton-Cadillac Hotel today and tomorrow in Detroit.

Coming up for consideration at the meeting is a recommendation that the size limit on northern pike be trimmed from 20 to 14 inches in the Fletcher Floodwaters of Alpena and Montmorency counties. The relaxed, experimental regulation is proposed to reduce an overstocked population of small-size pike. This would bring pike numbers into better balance with their food supplies and encourage better growth rates among fish that are not caught.

Another recommendation calls for lifting a five-year ban on northern pike fishing at Townline Lake, Montmorency county, where these fish appear to be coming back strong as a result of work conducted by the Department. The standard creel quota would apply under the proposed June 1-Sept. 30 season. However, a 27-inch size limit would be in effect rather than the statewide 20-inch limit.

DEPARTMENT fisheries men are recommending that Big Star Lake, Lake County, be closed to northern pike fishing during January and February. Studies indicate these fish need more protection to become established in the lake.

Some 139 lakes are recommended for designation as trout lakes. Included on this list is Manganese
