Blue Cross Expands Medical Division

Creation of two key administrative posts has emphasized the steady expansion of the Blue Cross Medical Division in its role of watchdog to prevent possible abuse of benefits. Dr. Edwin L. Harmon, division director, has named Dr. Harold L. Tremain to the newly-created position of assistant medical director and Miss Annalee C. Krause to the new post of administrator of the Blue Cross Home Care Program. Dr. Tremain, a 46-year-old Detroit specialist in obstetrics and gynecology, will share top administrative responsibilities over all the various Blue Cross benefit con-

post extensive experience in private practice, plus a broad range of hospital staff work and considerable experience in administrative medicine. He said the appointment of Miss Krause as administrator of the Blue Cross Home Care Program reflected its rapid growth and acceptance. Begun in 1960 on a pilot basis involving five Detroit hospitals, the Blue Cross Home Care Program proved so successful it was approved for extension throughout the state this year by the Blue Cross board of trustees and the Michigan Department of Insurance. "We anticipate extension of this program as more and more areas and hospitals qualify by developing organized home care facilities which meet our requirements," Dr. Harmon explained. Miss Krause will direct an ex-

panding program which already includes 19 Detroit-area hospitals, M in 1949 and a Master's degree in 1953. Active in many health and nursing organizations, she has served as chairman of the Nursing Services Committee of the Detroit and Tri-County League for Nursing; president of the Detroit District of the Michigan State Nurses Association and as a member of the Governor's Task Force on Public Health.

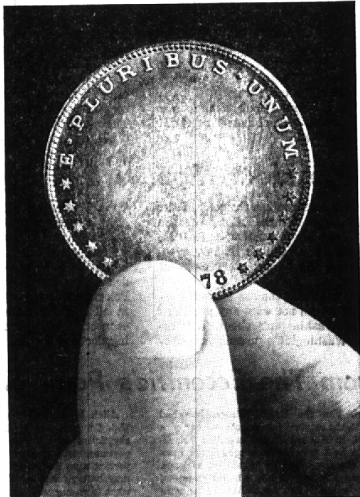
