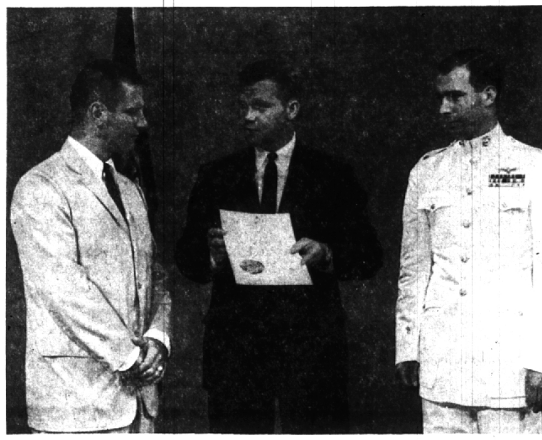

The 44 cadets entered the academy in July 1961 and completed the last term of instruction during 1962 field training at Camp Grayling.
