Set Hearings On Rezoning For Oct. 8

Birmingham city commissioners Monday night set two public hearings on rezoning matters for Oct. 8.

One is on a petition by Frank Nowell to rezone his property bounded by W. Maple, Waterfall Lane and City park property to anything other than residential.

He originally requested that part of his property be rezoned from R-1 single family to R-4 two family.

The city plan board has recommended that the petition be denied.

THE AREA IS now zoned single family and the requested change would be spot zoning, the planners contended.

They also said the property can be "adequately developed" as it is now zoned. Two-family or multiple-family zoning would cause a safety hazard with respect to vehicular access to Maple, the planners reported.

CITY - OWNED property on Lakeside north of Oak St. is involved in the second hearing to be held on Oct. 8.

The city seeks to sell a portion of this property which is reserved for flood plain purposes.

THE PLAN BOARD recommended that one parcel be rezoned and placed on the market, but commissioners included two parcels in the public hearing.

Planners felt that one of the parcels should be kept to provide access to the flood plain bordering the Rouge River.

Previous attempts to sell any part of this City property have failed, due largely to opposition from residents of the area.

Birmingham Gets \$35,242 From State Highway Monies

Birmingham's share of second quarter receipts in the state motor vehicle highway fund will be \$35,242. The fund, made up of state gasoline taxes, license and other fees, is distributed quarterly.

Other area villages and cities receiving distributions are Beverly Hills, \$14,288; Birmingham Farms, \$1,055; Bloomfield Hills, \$5,895; Lathrup Village, \$6,506; and Wood Creek Farms, \$1,567. The City of Southfield will receive \$22,480.

Receipts in the fund for the period, April through June, totalled \$144,784,800. Eighteen per cent of the fund is divided among 51 cities and villages for road and street maintenance.

Oakland County will receive \$911,969 as its share of the rebates.

Bits of Birmingham

Julie Candler, 1288 Dorchester, whose interest in civic affairs is above the average, believes that women today more than at any time since they received suffrage can play a tremendously constructive part in political-economic areas of our nation.

"But we women must be willing to devote more time to the study of such problems of we are to cast intelligently directed votes at election time," she said this week.

"For example, last Monday the Birmingham League of Women Voters held a meeting to which they invited Michigan candidates for the office of congressman-at-large. But only 20 minutes was allowed for the formal speeches of the three speakers, plus a half-hour for open questions from the audience. It is such limited time sufficient, both for candidates and the audience? Why, many times we women will give up a whole afternoon to some topic that is infinitely less basic importance to our own economic, political and social security. Why not be as generous with our time when we see information about issues and candidates at election time?"
