## Residents Ask For Hearing On Easement

BEVERLY HILLS—Seven residents of Cranbrook Woods subdivision signed a petition asking for a public hearing to determine the necessity for a proposed easement on Brezewood Court. The petition was presented to the council Monday.

Property owners on Brezewood Court object to the easement, which the planning board recommended be included in the adjacent River-

side Subdivision. It would allow pedestrian traffic onto Brezewood Court in the event such access is later found desirable.

THE PETITIONERS claim the easement is not necessary and said it is not based on known statistics, in their opinion, it would "destroy the nature of the Cranbrook Woods Sub and the original dedication," they claim.

Signers of the petition were Hiram Y. Pupkin, Frank H. Taylor, G. Muth, H. S. Earle, Roy C. Goulder, William Plajole and C. R. Harrison, all of Cranbrook Woods. Village Attorney Thomas J. Dillon will determine whether the easement can be removed.

thus assuring American labor of maximum employment.

STAEBLER, also a member of his party's national committee, asked for the support of President

Kennedy's foreign aid program. He strongly urged that we defend the existence of the United Nations, and support it, both financially and morally, in its efforts to improve international relations, including the preservation of peace.

"If, in the future the U.N. meets up with financial difficulties, as now exist, I believe the United States should rise to the need with less criticism, fewer restrictions on conditions to be met by other nations before we send money to the United Nations," declared Staebler.

He also strongly supports the forthcoming Kennedy Trade Bill, which, Staebler believes, will make possible "better export relations with Europe's proposed Common Market."

"PRESIDENT KENNEDY'S handling of the Berlin problem, when he recently called on U.S. military reserves, 'calmed those troubled waters some,' said Staebler. However, the subject of the Berlin Wall and the recent 'invasion' of Cuba by Soviet 'Communists' and military hardware, was not discussed by any of the speakers.

"I also believe that in extending foreign aid we should not be motivated by the hope that this way we are acquiring strong allies," continued the Democratic candidate. "Instead, we should extend aid in the hope that it will improve the internal conditions of a recipient country, making it more literate, better able to emerge into the process of self-government, and thus a defender of freedom."

THAT LAST SPEAKER was Socialist Labor Party candidate Muncy. He read from a paper he had written on the general subject.

In brief, he criticized both Republican and Democratic groups as claimants "to know-all and be-all." Despite this, said the Ann Arbor forestry consultant, "the world gets into frequent wars, and hundreds of millions of human beings remain the 'have-nots' at the hands of an exploiter-capitalist class."

"Only when capitalism is replaced by Socialism, when the masses acquire ownership and use of the lands and the tools of production will all nations finally emerge into a period of indefinite peace," declared Muncy.

Prior to the speaking part of the program, coffee and cakes were served to League members and guests.

MRS. HILFINGER opened the meeting, then turned it over to Mrs. Peter Krueger, League member from Lansing, who is chairman of the League's State Association committee on voters' service, who acted as moderator.

Some audience disappointment because of the brevity of the meeting was expressed, it being thought that so important an occasion warranted at least a two- or three-hour period for candidates, as well as questions from the audience to be answered.
