**Dem Hopeful Says Rate Bid Shows Needs**

The Blue Cross and Blue Shield request for a 50 per cent rate increase in their senior citizen plans points up the need for Congress to come to the aid of those people, declared George J. Fulkerson, Democratic nominee for the U.S. House of Representatives from the 18th District, in a prepared statement released last week.

Fulkerson, a Birmingham attorney and special assistant attorney general for the state of Michigan, favors a national medical care program for the elderly, financed through social security, with provision for those not covered by social security.

The Blue Cross and Blue Shield rate increase would make the plan prohibitively expensive for most elderly people living on fixed incomes, Fulkerson said.

**HE CHALLENGED** incumbent William Broomfield to take a stand on the issue of health care for the aged. The measure has been before Congress in one form or another since Broomfield was first elected in 1956, Fulkerson said.

**Bar Association Plans Course for Attorneys**

Plans are presently being made by the Oakland County Bar Association to sponsor an instructional course aimed at acquainting local attorneys with the extensive changes in Michigan court procedures brought about by the Revised Judiciary Act and the new Michigan General Court Rules, both of which will become effective Jan. 1, 1963.

Each attorney attending the course will be provided with three newly published books relating to the subject matter covered by the instruction. Registrations are being made through the committee for continuing legal education in Ann Arbor.

Plans on the campus at MSU on Oct. 18, the course will consist of 24 hours of classroom instruction under the leadership of law professors from Wayne State University and the University of Michigan as well as the Detroit College of Law. Classes will be in session on Thursday and Friday, 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. through Nov. 9.

**Freeway Approach To Midland Lined With Landscaping**

MIDLAND—This Eastern Michigan community, nationally known for its beautiful churches, buildings and gardens, is adding one of the nation's most beautiful freeway interchanges to its list.

As part of a local beautification program, the Dow Foundation is spending \$12,000 to provide 600 trees and shrubs at the Midland exit on the US-10 Freeway at the east entrance to the city.

The plantings include various types of maples, sycamores, pines and flowering trees.

MOTORISTS approaching Midland from the south see the landscaping as they approach an overhead sign pointing to the Midland exit at M-20.

The trees sweep over a hill toward the city. Other plantings dramatize the portal effect of the entrance.

Approaching the downtown area, the trees also serve as an offset screen between the freeway and neighboring residential areas, cutting down traffic noise. They also reduce the glare of oncoming automobile headlights at night.

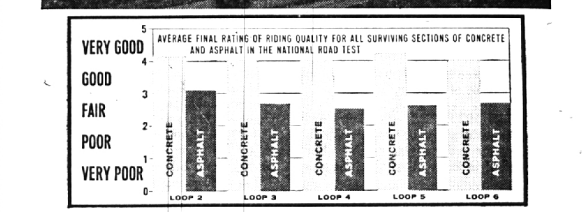
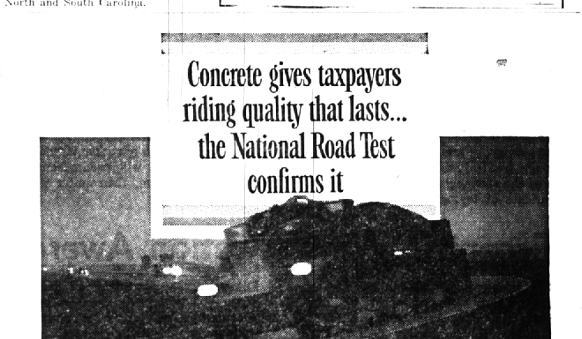
