## State Highway Aide To Fight Communism

LANSING—A Michigan State Highway Department bridge design engineer has left his drawing board for an assignment half-way around the world in Ethiopia.

His mission—to carry his war against communism to the African nation.

To Frank Hardy, 40, the assignment is not new. He had his first brush with the Communists in the mid-1930's and has been planning for this moment since the Soviet takeover in Hungary after World War II.

IN THE SIX years between 1948 and 1954, Hardy was an assistant professor in structural engineering at the Technical University of Budapest, Hungary.

He was forced out because he was not a Communist.

Between then and 1956, Hardy and his family planned, waited and prayed for an opportunity to flee their Communist-dominated country. Their chance came during confusion following a Soviet-suppressed revolution in 1956.

On a chilly August night, with Soviet flares bursting overhead, Hardy and his wife and four children crept through the shadows toward the Austrian border.

"I TOLD THE children we were playing hide and seek," Hardy said. They followed the edge of a forest into a cleared no-man's land. "We were falling in holes, always afraid we'd blow up. Then we came to the barbed wire and found a hole un-

derneath it and crawled into Austria.

The Hardys came to the United States in 1957 and moved to Lansing nearly three years ago. Frank became a U. S. citizen Aug. 2.

Hardy's chief weapon in his new fight against communism will be knowledge.

HE HAS signed a two-year contract as an associate professor at the Halle Science University in Adis Ababa in central Ethiopia.

"I believe that in the struggle between east and west, the west should send many teachers to these underdeveloped countries or else the east will," he said.

When the mission is accomplished, the Hardys plan to return to the U. S.

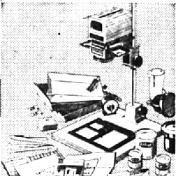
