LATHRUP—Speeding and running through a red light led the list in number of cases during the justice court process August. Forty-four persons charged with speeding were tried with a total of \$687 in fines and \$36 in costs assessed. Thirty-three people were

tried for running traffic signals and were fined \$175 and \$1 in costs. Other cases tried involved three persons charged with passing on the shoulder of the road and three for driving with an expired driver's license. Defective equipment and left turn through a red light accounted for two cases each.



Bus Driver Training Begins in 29 Counties

A school bus driver training program involving 3,600 drivers in 29 counties of southern Michigan is now in progress, according to David H. Soule, coordinator of bus driver education at Eastern Michigan University.

The training sessions are held in public schools throughout the various counties and involve 12 hours of study. Soule is coordinator for bus driver education throughout the southern half of the state.

Motorsists should be especially alert in view of a recent report by the state attorney general concerning school buses, he warned.

THE RULING requires all school buses to stop on the highways to load or unload. Formerly they were permitted to load and unload passengers on the shoulder of a road. Bus drivers are required to alert the motorist with front and rear flashing lights when ready to pick up or discharge passengers.

In Washtenaw County there are 141 school buses which travel 1,850,000 miles annually, carrying 10,427 student passengers. Ten school districts are involved in school bus transportation. Last year there were 27 accidents, none of them resulting in fatalities.

The cause of most of the accidents can be traced to several factors, Soule said. High on the list is motorist inattention and ignorance of the law regarding school buses. The unpredictability of children is also a high accident factor. So is increased exposure to accidents due to the continually expanding numbers of children, buses, and automobiles.

Parents should be certain children know how to walk and ride safely, he said. They should also know school rules for bus drivers, be certain that the children get to the bus safely and in time, and cooperate with bus drivers and school officials in setting safe bus stops and in maintaining proper behavior on the bus.

Motorsists should be alert and know the law. They should especially watch for a slowing or stopped bus, a bus with alternately flashing red lights, or children waiting by the side of the road, Soule said.
