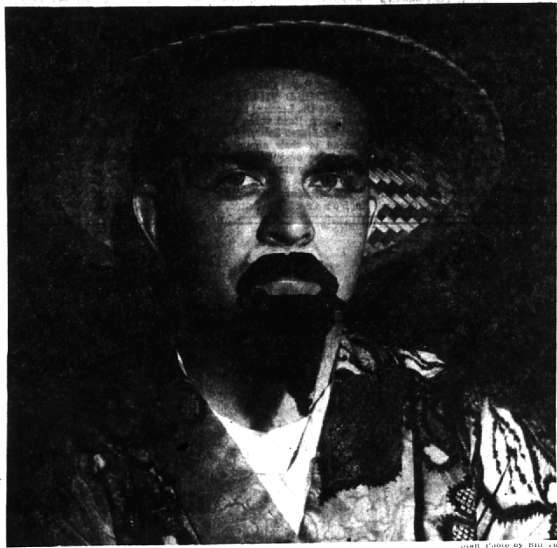


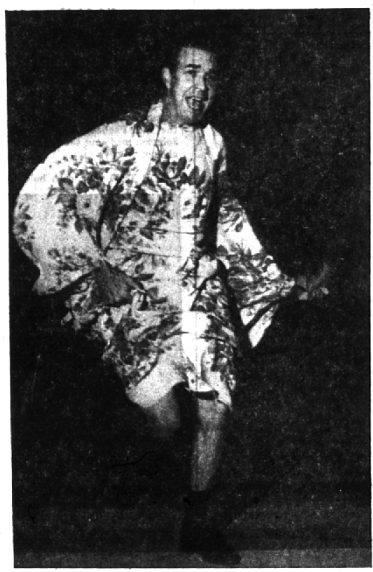
Cranbrook Village Goes Oriental at Block Party
