TRANFER OF REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY SEC. 507. Any registered elector who has removed from 1 election precinct of a Township, City or Village to another election precinct of the same Township, City or Village to another election precinct of the same Township, City or Village shall have the right to make application to have his registration transferred on any election day by executing a reuser of the election board in the precinct in which he is registered. Upon receiving such request, the inspector of election in charge of the registration records shall compare the signature upon the applicant's registration record and, if the signature upon the applicant's registration record and, if the signature upon the applicant for transfer shall then be permitted to vote in such precinct with the Township, City or Village Clerk who shall transfer such elector's registration in accordance with the application.
