Oakland Children's Village Proposed By Probate Judge

UNDER JUDGE MOORE'S proposal, the county would provide for two arrival centers to serve as initial shelters pending study, diagnosis and court disposition of the child.

One or more special education school buildings from kindergarten through the 10th or 11th grade, capable of providing for at least 300 children.

Administrative offices, either in a separate building or in one of the school buildings.

A health unit to provide an isolated sick ward for children, medical examination centers, dental clinic, eye clinic and for all other health needs with the exception of care for infants.

Dependent children's care units.

These should be cottages with house parents to receive and shelter neglected children for short periods pending court disposition, placement in boarding homes or adoption.

Nursery to house infants and pre-school-age children, providing them with medical attention and nurses.

ALSO PROVIDED would be cottages for emotionally disturbed children, intensive rehabilitation and training cottages for delinquents who remain in the county's care for a long time and a central kitchen to prepare and distribute food to the units.

Judge Moore made no estimate of the cost of the project but county officials say that it would run over \$1 million.

This & That Birmingham Mayor Raps After-Dinner Parley on Taxes

Mayor Florence H. Willett of Birmingham sided with Detroit Mayor Jerome Cavanagh last week in the belief that a dinner meeting is no place to talk about income taxes.

Cavanagh, hosting suburban mayors at the Veterans Memorial Building in Detroit, was challenged to a debate on the city's income tax by Royal Oak Mayor William Hayward, petition chairman of the Vigilance Committee, a group dedicated to the fight against city income levies.

Mayor WILLETT came to Cavanagh's aid, threatening to pull Birmingham out of the Vigilance Committee.

"I think this group should strive for larger cooperation in the metropolitan area," she said. "If instead it's going to devote itself to personal, sectional fights, I don't want to represent the City of Birmingham as a part of it."

She also said: "I don't think this association should be made a tool for the Vigilance Tax Committee."

She added that she would resign as the association's publicity chairman if income taxes were debated.

At the urging of Mark Storen, mayor of Highland Park, the income tax petition issue was referred to the association's subcommittee on taxes.

front 200 foot of the property's depth. The remaining depth would be devoted to parking space. An easement would give ingress and egress off of Big Beaver as well as Woodward.

He pointed out that a natural barrier of large trees exists between the property and adjoining residential areas and stated that the trees would be allowed to remain.

The central court of the motor-hotel units would be depressed, allowing two-and-a-half story buildings which would be only 22 feet higher than the natural terrain.

ARGUMENTS before the board for allowing the zoning change centered around the fact that the township has only one motel and a number of luxury-type restaurants.

The point was also made that the property was purchased when it had a general commercial classification and up until a few months ago, no zoning change would have been needed.
