### OK Tag Sale In B'ham for Blind School

Birmingham city commissioners granted permission Monday night to the Federation Nursery School for Visually Handicapped Children to stage a tag selling drive in the city.

The school is located at 28520 Eureka, Taylor. The drive will be on Oct. 19 or 20.

In his letter of request to the City of Birmingham, Thomas M. Kirk pointed out that the school does not receive any assistance from the United Foundation or Community Services.

It does receive support, however, from Lions Clubs and various individuals.

MRS. LILLIAN Ricker, founder and director of the school, was in the news last week.

It seems that in 1960 she helped the State Police to capture a man who had offered to sell that the nursery receive a bequest of \$13,000 if she would kick back \$1,300 to him.

Efforts to secure the bequest from the estate involved have failed to date, and Mrs. Ricker said the school is badly in need of money.

### Open Hunt Dispute Near Settlement

An eight-day-old walkout of groomers at the Bloomfield Open Hunt appeared near settlement Wednesday.

At press time, The Eccentric learned that the dispute would probably be settled at any minute and that the club would resume normal operation today.

The picket line was allegedly set up by groomers fired by the club for refusing to cross picket lines during the recent lengthy strike by cooks, bartenders and waitresses. The groomers also allegedly joined the union shortly before the strike began.

The City of Salem, but the operation is on a regional basis and he will work with a park board from each of the two counties.

CITY MANAGER L. R. Gare and personnel director B. S. Keating praised Gale for the work he has done in Birmingham and expressed regret at his leaving.

"We are very sorry to see him go," they said. "We congratulate him on his professional advancement, but his leaving will be a real loss to the city."

Terminating Gale a "dedicated conservationist," they told him he has taken time to touch nature and forestry-related subjects to local groups.

"He will be missed by the City and the residents," they declared.

No successor has been named yet. Keating said the City will advertise for a replacement. Determination has not been made of the salary range.

GALE CAME to Birmingham as superintendent in 1955. Previously, he had been the city forester in Ferndale a year and prior to that he had operated his own consulting service in the forestry and park field for 12 municipalities in the metropolitan area.

He is a 1951 graduate of Michigan State University, where he earned a bachelor of science degree in parks management and municipal forestry.

He was born Sept. 12, 1925, in Denver, Colo.

Gale, his wife, Helen, and their two children, Wendy, 13, and Dan, 10, reside at 1004 Stephen in Clawson.

### Expect Hearing On Sewer Project

City commissioners are expected to set a date at their meeting next week for a public hearing on the proposed Ruffner relief sewer in Birmingham.

A petition was received for the project on July 18, 1960. Commissioners have held up action on it and other relief sewers pending completion of the Twelve Town system.

The ENGINEERING department was instructed to review the design for the proposed Cummings relief sewer and to conduct a post card survey to determine the extent of basement flooding in that area.

This would involve the area bounded by Woodward, Chapin, Grant and 14 Mile.
